

From the Church

Taste and See

We have a few really good local Indian restaurants and occasionally when I go into them, they are busy. We are told the British love curries. Curry houses employ around 100,000 people and have average annual sales of £4.2bn. A few weeks ago a lawsuit was lodged in the Delhi High Court. The case in question concerns a dispute over which family can lay claim to direct lineage to the creator of one of India's most popular dishes – butter chicken! My family loves some of the milder curry dishes and this suddenly became a subject of interest.

Over seventy years ago the owner of an open-air diner needed to use up leftover tikkas and hit upon the idea of adding tomato gravy and dollops of butter. Fast forward to today and descendants of the original restaurant owners are fighting for the right to claim the dish as theirs.

In the end though, does it matter? If the dish tastes delicious wherever it is cooked, does it matter who took the lead in its invention?

As we reflect on all of this, we might think of the Church, which often seems to tie itself up in knots debating issues which might appear important, but they could well be a distraction from what Jesus called the early Church to do.

It could be so easy for us to lose sight of the only thing that matters. Which is that God so loved the world he sent his Son Jesus to come from heaven and live as one of us to make it known throughout the world that God loves us and wants us to be in a relationship with Him. So that whoever believes in Jesus need not perish but have eternal life.

No wonder the Psalmist says, 'Taste and see that the Lord is good!' (Ps 34:8). In the New Testament, Peter one of the disciples of Jesus says that if you follow Jesus you will indeed taste and see for yourself that the Lord is good. He says in 1 Peter 2-3 "now that you have tasted that the Lord is good." He and others have tasted the Christian way of life. For the readers of his letters in the New Testament, St Peter advises on how to live. He suggests we are to flee from selfish pride. Try not to harbour malice or deceit in our hearts and are to refrain from hypocrisy, insincerity, envy, and evil speaking. For Peter, to engage in such behaviour damages our Christian witness and discredits the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

That might sound quite a high benchmark but as you experience the Love of God in your heart, you find the desire to do things that are contrary to God's love are something you don't want to do. You recognise your heart wants to communicate God's love to the world more and more. If you want to come and join us for any of our services and events we would love you to join us and "Taste and see that the Lord is good."



Farmers' Market Recipe for April—Sherry Trifle

Traditional trifle recipe couldn't be easier, use ready-made custard and sponge to save time but don't skimp on the sherry!

Ingredients

1 packet trifle sponge fingers, broken into 5cm/2in pieces.

150g/5oz amaretti biscuits or ratafias

150ml/5fl oz sweet sherry (naughty but nice!)

1 tbsp cognac (again naughty but nice!)

4 tbsp blackberry or raspberry jam

450g/1lb fresh blackberries (or whatever fruit you like)

450g/11b fresh raspberries

85g/3oz toasted flaked almonds 600ml/1 pint ready-made custard

For the syllabub topping

125ml/4fl oz sherry

2 tbsp brandy

1 lemon, juice only

55g/2oz caster sugar

425ml/15fl oz double cream freshly grated nutmeg

To garnish

2 oranges, grated zest only 85g/3oz flaked almonds

Method

- 1. Lay the sponge pieces and biscuits in the base of a deep glass dish. Spoon over the sherry and cognac and leave to soak in for a few minutes.
- 2. Warm the jam in a bowl in the microwave or in a saucepan until it is runny then pour over the soaked sponge and biscuits. Sprinkle the fruit and flaked almonds on top. Pour over the custard.
- 3. To make the syllabub topping, place the sherry, brandy and lemon juice into a bowl and stir in the sugar until it dissolves. Pour in the cream with a pinch of nutmeg. Whisk until it holds its shape. Don't over-whisk, or whisk too vigorously, as the cream may split. Spoon the syllabub over the trifle and refrigerate, preferably overnight.
- 4. Just before serving, scatter with the grated orange rind and/or flaked toasted almonds.

The Night Sky in Hildenborough - April 2024

I suppose size has a lot to do with it, but yet again America comes out on top with another total eclipse of the Sun. This one is on April 8th and surprisingly the British Isles, whilst not included at the top table, does at least get to pick up a few of the eclipse crumbs. However, that isn't *all* of the British Isles and that means us here in the South East I'm sorry to say. The best views are to be had in Ireland and in general terms, the further West the better. Even then, just over 40% of the Sun will be hidden which is a poor second prize when compared to totality.


However, the alternative is to look online for a live stream and watch the whole thing from the comfort of your armchair. There are a few sites that have already declared that they will have a live feed with www.timeanddate.com and www.exploratorium.com being just two.

If you're looking further ahead then there is a very small partial eclipse of the Moon in September after which things begin to look up for our part of the world. We will see an almost total lunar eclipse and then a partial solar eclipse in March 2025 followed by a total lunar eclipse in September of the same year. Then in 2026 we see very large partial eclipses of both the Sun and Moon.

Turning to something a little more current, Jupiter still dominates the evening sky but by the end of April it will be lost in the twilight. If you haven't seen its four Galilean moons then look now, as they are visible with binoculars, before it reaches solar conjunction on May 18th and is lost to astronomers for a while. For planets whose orbits lie beyond that of the Earth, solar conjunction refers to the moment when the planet in question, the Earth and Sun all lie in a straight line with the Sun in the middle. The planet is then behind the Sun as seen from Earth. When it emerges, it will be to the west (right) of the Sun and visible in the morning sky before sunrise.

The map is drawn for 1st April at 8:07pm which is when the Sun is 6° below the horizon signalling the beginning of nautical twilight. You'll notice that Mercury is still on view, but is making its way back into the solar glare and will only be visible for the first week of April.

By the end of April, the evening sky is bereft of bright planets. As I said, Jupiter is too close to the Sun although technically still an evening object. Venus is also too close to the Sun but will move into the evening sky in the coming months whilst Mercury, Mars and



Saturn are also morning objects but they too are still hidden by the morning twilight.

Evening WI: Our March meeting started with welcoming our members. We went through some general WI business and updates of forthcoming events and activities.

We then had an interesting and entertaining talk from - 'Antonia Gallop, "A Gallop through the History of Carriage Riding".

She talked to us about the 1850s when ladies started to take the reins, from men, driving their own gigs and carriages, often supported by a servant. She talked through the different items of clothing that someone would wear when driving, the reason that gloves and reins should always be tan and not black, and the importance of the whip. This was usually made from the wood of the holly tree, it would be left to season for 7-9 years, a craftsman would add a goose feather and leather as well as a cord at the end for the noise. The whip helped the driver to communicate with the horse, to give it instructions.

She talked about how her interest in horses had started at a very early age, from the age of 6, asking her grandfather for a horse, and initially trying to ride one of his sheep, falling off and breaking her arm! She finally got her own pony when she was 7. She has driven carriages in several films and taken part in the London harness horse parade.

She explained that at the turn of the century these parades slowly helped to develop better welfare for working horses by their owners getting support from local farriers and vets, teaching them better ways to look after them and deal with issues they had when working with them. She gave us a brilliant talk, full of facts and humour, talking about a career packed with fascinating stories and clearly a deep knowledge and love for these beautiful animals.

We finished our evening with a cup of tea and some lovely cakes kindly made by Val. Jan told us about a recent charity event that her and Val had taken part in to raise money and awareness of Domestic Abuse.

Our next meeting is **Tuesday 9th April** when we will be having <u>a talk</u> by Chris McCooey-"Kent Scandals, Sensational, Salacious and Sad over the years".

The evening WI meets once a month and gives members the opportunity to meet new people, learn new skills, and have fun. We always welcome new members, so please feel free to just drop in and say hello, even just for one evening to see what we are all about.

T.M.B.C. News

Non-Taxed Cars.

I received an enquiry regarding parked untaxed cars, and who deals with them. I decided to task the Police and Crime Commissioner to supply an answer and courtesy of PS Nick Atkinson who sourced the information from the Police National Legal Database which is as follows:

In terms of vehicles being used without a valid MOT, police have powers to issue a fine if the vehicle is being used; for a vehicle to be used it needs to be "employed for some purpose; put into service'. If it is parked in a car park or road and not being driven, then we don't have the power to issue a ticket. If the vehicle is abandoned i.e. not moved for a period of time and not being used, then it needs to be reported to the local council who would deal.

Vehicles without vehicle excise duty (road tax) are dealt with by the DVLA. Like the MOT situation, the vehicle needs to be <u>used</u> for the police to be able to deal with any offences. If the vehicle is parked on a public road or car park, then the details need to be disclosed to the DVLA and they can send a fine to the registered keeper. However, if the vehicle is parked on private property, then the registered keeper would need to declare the vehicle is SORN (off the road) and then would not be required to pay the vehicle excise duty.

The Angel Centre.

In February, I asked if any residents had any opinions or views concerning the future of the Angel Centre. I can report that I received no comments from residents.

Bus Stop Seat.

Unfortunately, the offer of Oxy-Acetylene welding for the seat at the bus stop has not been productive. It is likely that KCC will remove the seat on the basis that it is not safe.

Haysden Country Park.

Haysden Country Park is a real success for TMBC, it has evolved over the years and is a place to go for many people and not just those who live within TMBC. The park scores an overall satisfaction of 99% from visitors. The market survey for 2023 has just been published; this was a face-to-face survey of 402 visitor groups in July and August. The report runs for 88 pages, a few headlines; average distance travelled to the park is 7.5miles, 59% of visitors live within TMBC, 2nd highest was Tunbridge Wells at 18%. Visitors stayed at the park between 1.5 and 2 hours. But of course, there is always room for improvement, 44 % wanted more wildlife/wildflower areas, 43% wanted visitor centre and 42% wanted exercise trail equipment around the park. If you would like a copy as a PDF please let me know and I will send you one.

For many of us in Hildenborough we use the facilities in Tonbridge as one of our nearest towns. It is a wonderful town with plenty of facilities and a High Street that continues to look well, despite the challenges of larger towns including Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells.

Sainsbury's store in Tonbridge is central to the town. You may have heard over the last few weeks that Sainsbury's have committed to renovating the former Beales site, next door to their current store. Their plans include developing a much larger store which will see an investment of up to £20 million into the town which I know so many of us travel to on a regular basis.

Due to the scale of this investment its impact will no doubt be felt far and wide across our community. The re-development of the former Beales unit is something that I have been calling for ever since it was left empty, some four years ago. Last year I supported the '3 Years Empty Is Plenty' campaign which was backed by nearly 2,000 people and helped prompt Sainsbury's into acting. Thank you to everyone across Hildenborough who signed this.

The new development will take place over the next two years, with an intended opening date being around Christmas 2025. The new store will see improved ranges across groceries, homeware clothing, and Argos and will also go a long way to improving the look of the largest town across Tonbridge and Malling. It will also help to create up to 50 new jobs in the local community and help to regenerate a key central location while installing important amenities such as 6 ultra-rapid electric charging points for electric cars. Sainsbury's also plan on the store being entirely net-zero.

Highways

As many residents will already have noticed, the bollards in front of The Flying Dutchmen have now been installed to prevent dangerous undertaking at the junction with Leigh Road.



The wigwags (flashing warning lights) in Riding Lane have also been installed, ready to be programmed to operate during school drop -off and pick-up times. Thank you to Kent County Council for implementing both measures to improve road safety for the residents of Hildenborough.

In addition to the above, the Parish Council will be investigating further traffic calming measures that may be introduced in certain "hot spots" in the village. In the meantime,

Kent County Council have provided the Parish Council with a "30mph Toolkit" consisting of bin stickers, posters and a PVC banner to raise awareness of the 30mph speed limit. Once placed on a rubbish/recycling bin, the bin stickers are a simple but effective way to remind motorists of the speed limit if you live in a road affected by speeding motorists. Stickers will be available to pick up from the Parish Councillor attending the Farmers' Market on the second Tuesday of the month, and arrangements will be made to distribute the stickers to local outlets in Hildenborough where they can be picked up. You can also email the Clerk to arrange to collect one. Five sets of dropped kerbs are due to be installed in the Brookmead area of Hildenborough by this summer.

Open Spaces

One of the issues raised at the Annual Parish Meeting was the problem of flooding on the Village Green which, during prolonged periods of heavy rain, encroaches upon properties bordering the Green. the Parish Council planted three willow trees on the Village Green a couple of years ago, a species of tree known for being very "thirsty", but it will take a while for the trees make a difference. Cllr Sklavenitis assured the residents that the Parish Council are going to be looking into the matter again to see what further measures could be taken to resolve the problem.

Tales from the Churchyard: The artist

Outside the vestry door at St John's is a simple stone cross on a small plinth. The modest cross is not the largest memorial in the Churchyard but being situated outside the Vestry door puts it in a prominent position. This is the memorial to the family of our once most famous resident; the artist John Frederick Herring Sr. He is ranked by art historians alongside Sir Edwin Landseer as one of the eminent animal painters of midnineteenth century Europe. John Frederick Herring Sr. (senior) lived with his large family at Meopham Bank in Leigh Road from 1853 until he died in 1865. Today his paintings are in the catalogues for thousands of pounds. He has the suffix Senior as his son also John Frederic Herring was an even more significant artist.

Born in Surrey in 1795 of American parents, he married in London against his father's wishes and left home with his young wife. At Doncaster races in 1814 he sketched the winning horse, the first of many. During his life John went from earning a living as a Coach driver with the occasional commission to sketch a horse or to paint Inn signs to being wealthy as his paintings sold, to having his fortunes change and facing bankruptcy. He

was rescued by a wealthy client who took him on to paint his horses. For many years he continued as a Coachman as well as a painter. In his latter years he was successful as an artist and was able to afford to buy Meopham Bank which had only been built in 1830. In the years when he was regularly painting horses, his main commissions




were to paint the winners of the big races. He painted the famous horse "Mameluke" the winner of the Derby in 1827 and many other

winners in the years to come. Today, you would have a photo taken of the winner but photography was only invented in the early 1800s and usable black and white photographs on glass plates were first developed in the 1820s. Colour photography started in 1861 but was



difficult as it took hours to develop the prints. Much of John's work was for publications in the sporting magazines of the day and also to meet the fashion for sporting prints. In his twelve years at Meopham Bank, he did not produce as many painting as he had when he was younger and healthier. In later years he suffered badly from asthma and gout. His earlier years as a Coachman had not been kind to his health and was often seen being pushed around the village in a wheelchair. He produced several paintings of local villages and one of his pictures from 1857 is entitled "The artist's Farmyard at Meopham, Kent." His pictures give us an insight into the times and the quality of his work. Some of his local pictures include churches but none of these is of St. John's (built in 1844) which was probably too new to be a fitting subject. John Frederick Herring Sr died in 1865. The family memorial just outside the vestry door is a fitting monument to a great but modest artistic family. His memorial also commemorates his first wife Ann who died in 1838 at the age of 43 leaving him with seven children, three boys (another boy born in 1819 had died at the age of two) and four girls. The memorial also commemorates his second wife Sarah whom he married in 1838 less than eight months after the death of Ann. On the memorial is also the name of his Artist son. also John Frederick, who became a more famous artist than his father.

SPRING BUDGET - VAT REGISTRATION THRESHOLD INCREASE

The thresholds for VAT registration and deregistration have remained static for the last 7 years, however an increase in the thresholds was announced in the Spring Budget.

From 1 April 2024, the new registration threshold will be £90,000, increased from £85,000. The deregistration threshold will also increase to £88,000 (from £83,000).

VAT registration becomes compulsory if by the end of any month, your business's VAT taxable turnover for the previous 12 months goes above the threshold. This needs to be looked at on a rolling monthly basis, and not just at your accounting year end. It is possible to apply for a registration

'exception' if you believe that you are only temporarily going above the threshold, for instance, because of winning a large one-off project. Provided you can show evidence as to why your turnover will be below the deregistration threshold in the next 12 months then HM Revenue and Customs are willing to consider making an exception.
